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Score is in C. *Dusk* has been arranged for four voices, and parts are included in C, Bb, Eb, F, and Treble, Bass, and Alto clefs, as well as octave transpositions for every part. I encourage you to refer to my original band and orchestra versions\* for instrumentation ideas based on the players you have available to you. Feel free to assign solo moments and adjust orchestration as warranted. I hope you experiment freely in rehearsal and invite your players to make suggestions, switch parts, etc., to gain a deeper understanding of the impact instrumentation, octave placement, and density have on our experience of music. My goal with this adaptation is for the conductor and players to gain deeper insight into how music is put together, and how their intentional decisions are critical in all of their performances.

It's about MUCH more than the notes!

### Program Note

This simple, chorale-like work captures the reflective calm of dusk, paradoxically illuminated by the fiery hues of sunset. I'm always struck by the dual nature of this experience, as if witnessing an event of epic proportions silently occurring in slow motion. *Dusk* is intended as a short, passionate evocation of this moment of dramatic stillness.

*Dusk* is part of a three-work "night cycle," continuing with *The Marbled Midnight Mile*, and concluding with *First Light*.

### Performance Tips

The work should be warm, slow, and extremely legato, with natural rubato. The biggest challenges are intonation (because of the sustained tones, and the cluster chords), and endurance at the marked tempo. Vibrato should be kept to an absolute minimum, especially wherever there are chord clusters. In particular, the flutes should minimize their natural tendency toward vibrato. The climax of the work should not rush - there's no *accelerando* from m. 36 to m. 42. M. 42 should be the loudest point, and there must be no breath at the end of m. 41 - sustain the chord and push into m. 42. Staggered breathing is required in many places - use as necessary.

## 4-voice Flexible Ensemble Part Assignment Guide

Here's an initial part assignment guide to get you started with this flexible version of *Dusk*. While all players may simply play their parts as written, I encourage you to experiment with the orchestration, particularly if you have more than the minimum four voices available to you. Feel free to assign certain melodic phrases as solos, using the original band or orchestra versions of the piece as a guide, or even try some things that are counterintuitive: for example, give the opening solo line in measures 2-3 in Part III to various instruments in the ensemble, from Flute to Tuba, and see how it affects the music. Do the same with the Part II line in measure 4. Consider how the two relate to each other, and how the instrument choices for one affects the other.

I intend for this version of *Dusk* to be an experimental playground and a vehicle for you and your ensemble (of whatever size and instrumental combination) to learn how music is far more than the notes on the page. I hope that through this exercise, the musicians will gain a deeper understanding of the impact of their choices on how we hear a piece of music, and ultimately that they transfer this awareness to their future musical performances.

Recommended part assignments. Start here if you aren't sure where to begin, and reassign as necessary.
